#### Introduction

Research Bank is an Institutional Research Repository (IRR) in which research carried out at EIT (Eastern Institute of Technology), Otago Polytechnic, Toi Ohomai Institute of Technology, SIT (Southern Institute of Technology) and United Institute of Technology is made available to the world.

The purpose of Research Bank is to make our research as widely available as possible, by providing free access to it online, and making it easily found by search engines.

This repository was developed using DSpace, an open-source software platform. Contents of the repository are available via search engines such as Google Scholar. The repository is also accessible from several global IRR aggregators, e.g. <a href="OpenDOAR - Sherpa Services">OpenDOAR - Sherpa Services</a>

#### What are the benefits of Research Bank?

Institutional Research Repositories like Research Bank have become universal features of contemporary tertiary institutions. Every university in New Zealand has a repository. The benefits of having a repository include the following:

- Research Bank makes research freely available around the world. Collecting all our research in one place makes the range of the work clear
- Its status as a research institution is thereby enhanced, making it more attractive to prospective staff and students
- Research is more visible and easier to find and link to.
  - o Research that is easier to find is more widely read, increasing its impact and citation rates.
  - o Each record has a "permanent URL" which researchers can forward to interested parties knowing the link will keep working even if the IRR platform or institution name changes.

#### What kind of research is collected in Research Bank?

Research Bank collects a range of different types and formats of research including images and video as well as written documents such as: journal articles, theses and conference papers.

#### Who can use Research Bank?

Research Bank is an open-access resource that is available to everyone. If for some reason the item is restricted from open access then it's not eligible for inclusion.

## How do I find material in Research Bank?

Two options:

- 1. For free text searching on every page click on the magnifying glass on the upper right-hand corner (next to "Log in"). On the home page you can also use the free text search box at the top with the words "Search the repository ...".
- 2. For a more targeted search use Browse Research Bank" on the upper left-hand side. There are options to search By Study Area, By Author, By Issue Date etc.
