Responsibility of Chair:

Welcome, Introduction and conclusion

Introduce yourself and welcome the participants and presenters. Check in that the three presenters are there. Introduce the first presenter (name and affiliation and co-authors and the title of the paper)

After each presentation and Q&A, thank the presenter and lead the audience in acknowledgement and applause.

Synchronisation of Concurrent session blocks:

Each session block will have 3 presentations. Each presentation will be for about 20 minutes and 10 minutes for questions and transition to the next presentation. Please ensure that presentation start at the scheduled time so that concurrent sessions are synchronised to allow attendees/participants to moving between current sessions after each presentation.

Time Keeping:

Please keep to the 20 minutes presentation time and signal to the presenter the time that they have remaining (suggest reminding the presenter at the 5- and 2-minutes remaining point). Keep to the 10 minutes Q&A with any additional question to be discussed during the break sessions if you run out of time.

Questions and Answers

During the Q& A component of the presentation the chair is encouraged to prepare some questions and discussion points to facilitate feedback to the presenter. Feedback may include what you found most interesting in the paper and how the paper could be strengthen going forward. Some suggested questions are noted below.

- 1. What are your plans for the paper going forward (journals etc)?
- 2. Who is your primary audience in preparing this paper?
- 3. What interested you most in preparing this paper?
- 4. Any other more specific and directed questions relating to the presentation.
